MINIMUM CHARGES

The minimum monthly charge to farm and home consumers billed under the above rate shall be \$2.00 for single-phase service. The minimum monthly charge for three-phase farm and home service shall be 75¢ per KVA of installed transformer capacity. Payment of the minimum charge shall entitle the consumer in all cases to the use of the number of kilowatt hours corresponding to the minimum charge in accordance with the foregoing rate.

The minimum annual charge to churches, schools and community halls billed under the above rate shall be \$12.00 for single-phase service or \$9.00 per KVA of installed transformer capacity for three-phase service. Bills for actual usage shall be rendered each month during which energy is used without regard to monthly minimum charge. If at the end of twelve months the total charges are less than the minimum annual charge, the difference shall be added to the bill for the twelfth month.

DELAYED PAYMENT CHARGE

The above rates are net. Gross rates are five per-cent higher. If the current monthly bill is not paid by the fifteenth of the month following the meter reading date, the gross rates shall then apply. No delayed payment charge shall be applicable to churches, schools and community halls under this rate schedule.

DETERMINATION OF BILLING DEMAND

The billing demand shall be the maximum kilowatt demand established by the consumer for any period of 15 consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a demand meter and adjusted for power factor.

POWER FACTOR ADJUSTMENT

The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. Demand charges will be adjusted to correct for average power factors lower than 80% when the Seller deems necessary. Such

MINIMUM MONTHLY CHARGE

The minimum monthly charge under the above rate shall be \$2.00 for single-phase service. The minimum monthly charge for three-phase service shall be 75¢ per KVA of installed transformer capacity. Where it is necessary to extend or re-enforce existing distribution facilities, the minimum monthly charge may be increased to assure adequate compensation for the added facilities. Where the minimum charge is increased in accordance with the terms of this section, additional energy and demand shall be included in accordance with the foregoing rate schedule.

MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE FOR SEASONAL SERVICE

Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons not exceeding 9 months per year may guarantee a minimum annual payment of 12 times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with the foregoing section, in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge. Billing shall be on a calendar year basis.

TEMPORARY SERVICE

Temporary service may be supplied to circuses, carnivals, fairs, and services of a transient nature in accordance with the foregoing rate except that the consumer shall pay, in addition to the foregoing charges, the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service, less the value of materials returned to stock. An advance deposit may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

If service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of 10% shall apply to the demand and energy charges. If the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of 10% shall also apply to the minimum charge. However, service may be metered at secondary voltage and adjusted to primary metering by adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt-hours and kilowatt demand.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

The above rates are net, the gross rates being 5% higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within 15 days from the date of the bill, the gross rates shall apply.

SPECIAL RULE

Consumers having their homes on the same premises with their business establishments may make provision for two meters, in which case usage for residential purposes shall be billed under the appropriate residential rate schedule, and usage for business purposes shall be billed under this rate schedule, otherwise the entire service shall be billed under this rate schedule.

2. A charge of \$0.75 per KVA of installed transformer capacity.
3. A charge of \$50.00.

MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE FOR SEASONAL SERVICE

Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons, not exceeding 9 months per year, may guarantee a minimum annual payment of 12 times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with the foregoing section in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge. Billing shall be on a calendar year basis.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **SCOPE** - This Schedule of Rules and Regulations is a part of all contracts for receiving electric service from the Cooperative and applies to all service received from the Cooperative whether the service received is based upon a contract, agreement, signed application, or otherwise. No employee or individual director of the Cooperative is permitted to make an exception to rates or Rules and Regulations. Rates and rules of service may be obtained from the Cooperative's office.
2. **REVISIONS** - These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented or otherwise changed from time to time without notice. Such changes, when effective, shall have the same force and effect as the present Rules and Regulations. The members shall be informed of any changes as soon as possible, after adoption by the Board of Directors, through the Cooperative's monthly newsletter.
3. **CONSUMER'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR COOPERATIVE'S PROPERTY** - All meters, service connections, and other equipment furnished by the Cooperative shall be, and remain, the property of the Cooperative. The member shall exercise proper care to protect the property of the Cooperative on its premises and, in the event of loss or damage to the Cooperative's property arising from neglect of member to care for same, the cost of necessary repairs or replacements shall be paid by the member.
4. **CONTINUITY OF SERVICE** - The Cooperative shall use reasonable diligence to provide a constant and uninterrupted supply of electric power and energy. However, if such supply should fail or be interrupted or become defective through act of God, or public enemy, or by accidents, strikes, labor troubles, or by action of the electric utility, or inability to secure rights-of-way or other permits needed, or for any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the Cooperative, the Cooperative shall be not liable therefor.
5. **RELOCATION OF LINES BY REQUEST OF MEMBERS** - The Cooperative's established lines shall not be relocated unless the expense for moving and relocating is paid by the member, except in instances where it would be to the advantage of the Cooperative to make such relocation.
6. **SERVICES PERFORMED FOR MEMBERS** - The Cooperative's personnel are prohibited from making repairs or performing services to the member's equipment or property except in cases of emergency or to protect the public or member's person, or property. When such emergency services are performed the member shall be charged for same based on time and material required.

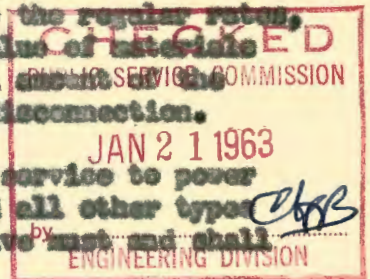
RULES AND REGULATIONS

7. APPLICATION FOR SERVICE - Each prospective member desiring electric service shall be required to sign the Cooperative's "Application for Membership and Electric Service," before service is supplied by the Cooperative and provide the Cooperative with necessary easements or right-of-way permits.
8. MEMBERSHIP FEE - The membership fee as set forth in the By-Laws shall be five dollars (\$5.00), upon the payment of which a member shall be eligible for one service connection. An additional fee of five dollars (\$5.00) shall be charged for each additional service. The membership fee shall be refunded, if all bills are paid, or shall be applied against any unpaid bills of the member at the time service is discontinued, which will automatically terminate the membership. Service covered by each meter shall be billed separately.
9. RIGHT OF ACCESS - The Cooperative's employees shall have access to member's premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading meter, testing, repairing, removing, or exchanging any and all equipment belonging to the Cooperative.
10. MEMBER'S DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE - Any member desiring service discontinued or changed from one location to another shall give the Cooperative three (3) days notice in person or in writing, provided such notice does not violate contractual obligations.
11. TEMPORARY SERVICE - Temporary service may be supplied to circuses, carnivals, fairs, and services of a transient nature in accordance with the existing rate schedules of the Cooperative except that the consumer shall pay, in addition to the regular rates, the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service less the value of materials returned to stock. An advance deposit may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.
12. SERVICE TO CONSUMERS WHICH MAY BE OF SHORT DURATION - In cases of service to power the pumping of oil wells, the operation of oil fields, and any and all other types of consumer services which may be of short duration, the Cooperative must and shall protect its investments on same in the following manner:

The consumer, at the time application is made for such service, shall pay a deposit to the Cooperative, in each instance, an amount equal to the cost of construction and retirement, covering both material and labor involved, less salvage value on all material returned into stock. This deposit may be refunded at the rate of ten percent (10%) of the consumer's monthly power bills thereafter.

In case of a transfer of the lease or ownership on an oil well, or other property, the parties involved may make the necessary arrangements regarding the transfer of the deposit and settlement of same.

- 13. METER TESTS** - All meters shall be checked for accuracy before installation. The Cooperative shall, at its own expense, make periodic tests and inspections of its meters in order to maintain a high standard of accuracy and to conform with the regulations of the Public Service Commission.

The Cooperative shall make additional tests of meters at the request of the member upon advance payment of a fee of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50). When the test, made at the member's request, shows the meter to be accurate within 2% slow or fast, no billing adjustment shall be made and the fee paid shall be forfeited to cover cost of the test.

When test shows the meter to be in excess of 2% fast or slow, an adjustment shall be made to the member's bill by recalculating the monthly bills for a period equal to one-half (1/2) of the time lapsed since the last previous test, which in no case shall exceed twelve (12) months and the cost of testing shall be borne by the Cooperative and the two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) fee paid by the member shall be refunded.

- 14. FAILURE OF METER TO REGISTER** - In the event a member's meter shall fail to register, the member shall be billed from the date of such failure at the average consumption of the member based on the three (3) month period immediately preceding the failure.

- 15. DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE BY COOPERATIVE** - The Cooperative may refuse to connect or may discontinue service to a member for the violation of any of its rules and regulations. The Cooperative may discontinue service to a member for theft of current or for the appearance of current-theft devices found on the premises of the member. The discontinuance of service by the Cooperative for any cause under this rule does not release the member from his obligation for all bills due.

- 16. POINT OF DELIVERY** - The point of delivery is the point designated by the Cooperative on member's premises where current is to be metered. All wiring and equipment beyond this point of delivery shall be supplied and maintained by the member. The member shall, however, notify the Cooperative of any proposed changes in his equipment or wiring which will materially increase or decrease his load so the Cooperative may check its equipment for adequacy to accommodate the consumer's requirement.

- 17. CONSUMER'S WIRING** - All wiring of the member must conform to Cooperative's requirements and accepted modern standards. The member agrees to wire his premises in accordance with specifications at least equal to those prescribed by the National Electrical Code. The Cooperative, however, assumes no responsibility in respect to the type, standard of construction, protective equipment or the condition of the member's property, and will not be liable for any loss or injury

to persons or property occurring on the premises or property of the member.

The member agrees to operate and maintain its facilities so as not to interfere with the service of the Cooperative to its other members. The member will have complete responsibility for all construction, operation, and maintenance beyond the meter and will save the Cooperative harmless against liability for injury or damages resulting in any manner from construction, location, operation, or maintenance of the member's facilities.

18. INSPECTION - All consumer's wiring must be inspected and approved before permanent connection for electric service is made by the Cooperative except where temporary service is desired during the construction of any permanent building. Fee for such inspection is payable at the Cooperative office.

19. METER READING - Each member receiving service shall supply the Cooperative with monthly readings on such date as designated by the Cooperative. Upon failure by the member to supply the Cooperative with three consecutive meter readings the Cooperative shall then read the meter and charge the member two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) for the extra service rendered. In the event an error in meter reading is made or member fails to return meter reading, the member shall pay an amount approximately equal to his average bill.

20. MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE FOR SEASONAL SERVICE - Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons, not exceeding 9 months per year, may guarantee a minimum annual payment of 12 times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with the rate applicable. In this case there shall be no minimum monthly charge. Payment of minimum annual charge shall entitle the consumer to the use of the corresponding number of kilowatt-hours in accordance with the rate applicable.

Charges shall be computed each month during which service is used in accordance with the rate applicable. The minimum annual charge shall be paid in advance each year before service is connected. No deduction shall be allowed for payments in excess of the minimum annual charge during the previous season. In case the consumer requires more than 3 KVA transformer capacity, the minimum annual charge may be increased at the rate of nine dollars (\$9.00) per additional KVA. The Cooperative may also charge for the cost of connecting and disconnecting this type of service.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

21. CONSUMER BILLING AND COLLECTING POLICY - Bills are to be mailed on or before the first day of each month covering service rendered during the month ending at the first of the preceding month.

Electric energy bills are due and payable from first through fifteenth of each month. Failure to receive bill shall not release the obligation to pay.

Delinquent letters are to be sent out on or about the 19th of each month.

Field collection date for delinquent accounts shall be on or about the 25th of each month.

The money or the meter is to be secured on field collection date.

A \$2.50 fee is to be collected on first call and on all subsequent calls for purposes of collecting delinquent accounts.

No consumer is to be reconnected at any location without first having paid all previous indebtedness to Cooperative.

Invoice statement to be issued on or about 19th of following month covering each delinquent account.

Periodically all unpaid invoice statements are to be turned over to an attorney or competent collecting agency for further proceedings, provided such amount exceeds the membership fee.

When checks are returned from Bank marked "Insufficient Funds" the drawer of said check is to be notified by letter and his service placed on the cut-off list along with other delinquent accounts and handled in the same manner as outlined above.

All consumers are to be members of the Cooperative. Cases of failure to pay membership fee shall be treated in the same manner as outlined above on delinquent accounts.

When a member-consumer is delinquent, the Cooperative may require an advance deposit of an amount equal to the estimated electric bills for two months. In certain cases of temporary service, and/or questionable cases, an advance deposit for two months estimated consumption may be charged at the time of initial service connect. Such advance payments may be refunded or consumed in electric energy used after 24 months of prompt payment.
